## Description

Funerary customs among the Dayak include two burials of the deceased. First upon death, the body is wrapped and left in or near the family home. At a later date and after decomposition, the bones are moved to a coffin, or ossuary, which is placed in a common burial ground for the community—usually in a natural rock and cliff environment.
