### Description

This mask comes from the Tolai people residing in West
New Britain Province in Papua New Guinea, and it dates to
the 20th century. White is the color of death in
Melanesian culture and this dance mask called lorr (skull)
likely represents a ghost or other manifestation concerned
with the afterlife. These masks found on the southern
west coast of New Ireland, New Britain's Gazelle
Peninsula, and the Duke of York Islands located between,
were linked to ceremonies regarding death and the spirit
realm.
