Miao aprons are typically worn over the skirts of women. The shiny cloth used in this piece is a common feature of

Miao textile work. It is created through a process known as calendering. As the Miao people inhabit different areas and countries, the specific materials used in calendering vary depending on the organic materials available in a specific location. The significant amount of time needed to create this shiny cloth is consistent across methods and is a testament to the Miao's attention to detail and idea of beauty.
