

# **Chest Ornament (Wopok)**

#### Medium

Nassa shell, plant fiber and plastic

## Description

Men's chest ornaments are worn over the sternum as a protective layer for warfare and as protection from malevolent spirits. These adornments, also called wopok, are said to have been worn as part of the regalia of the edai dance which celebrates the death of an enemy.
