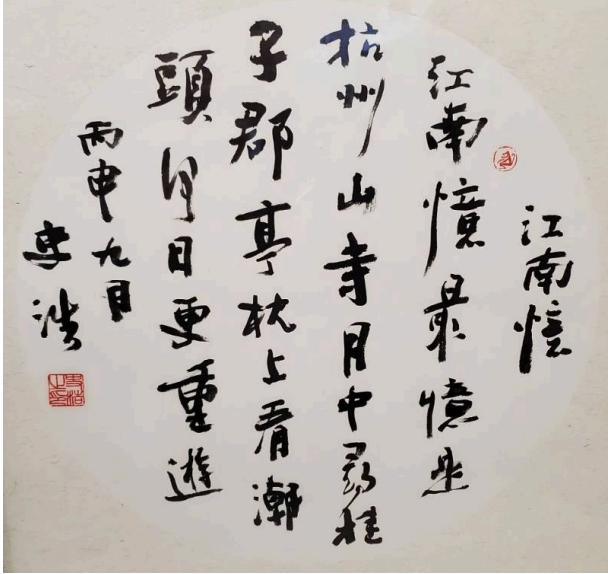

This calligraphy is an ink on paper painting by Taiwanese artist Howard Shih. The painter's ancestral home was Jinling, and his grandfather was Mr. Shi Liangcai, a prominent journalist in early 20th century Shanghai. Howard Shih graduated from the University of California. He studied literature and calligraphy since childhood. He is the head of California Chinese Calligraphy & Painting Academy, and vice-president of the United States Lanting Pavilion organization.
